Mr. Stemplewicz:

I have received your January 11, 2016 letter regarding the *Bridge Width Evaluation* for the Headquarters Road over Tinicum Creek project in Tinicum Township, Bucks County. Upon review, there continues to be a misunderstanding of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), as well as its relationship to the overall project development process.

The level of NEPA documentation is determined during the early stages of project development and is based upon whether or not the potential impacts of the proposed project would be considered "significant". In the case of the Headquarters Road over Tinicum Creek project, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) as the lead federal agency, in coordination with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT), has determined that a Level 2 Categorical Exclusion (CE) is appropriate as the potential impacts would not be considered "significant" under NEPA.

The *Bridge Width Evaluation* was prepared at the request of the FHWA to justify whether or not a single-lane structure would meet the Purpose and Needs of the project. The *Evaluation* was not prepared for the purpose of vindicating the level of NEPA documentation. The FHWA thus agreed with the conclusions of the *Evaluation* that a single-lane structure would not meet the Purpose and Needs of the project in the June 16, 2015 letter to PennDOT.

The project development process is ongoing and the FHWA and PennDOT continue to address NEPA requirements. Therefore, the Level 2 CE is still under preparation. It is worth noting that a public hearing will be held for the project – not a requirement, but important given the level of interest in the project.
