DELAWARE RIVERKEEPER NETWORK AND TINICUM CONSERVANCY
TO LEAD A CREEK RESTORATION EVENT

Erwinna, PA - The Delaware Riverkeeper Network and the Tincum Conservancy will lead volunteers in removing non-native invasive plants along Swamp Creek near the historic Erwinna Covered Bridge on Saturday, May 18th from 9 A.M. until noon. The volunteers will remove invasive plants threatening to overrun the native habitat along the creek.

This effort is a follow-up to the streambank and habitat restoration completed earlier this year by the Delaware Riverkeeper Network and Paul W. Steinbeiser Inc. that utilized native plants and natural materials. The restoration project improved the riparian habitat along 1,300 linear feet of the creek and stabilized eroding streambanks, utilizing funding from Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, Pennsylvania Tree Vitalize and private donations.
